

NCCP STATUS GUIDE In Alberta


Steps to view your NCCP Status:

All coaches must have 'trained' or 'certified' status in the context in which they intend to coach. AquaGO!/Recreational must be minimally 'trained' AquaGO! or Synchro Instructor (previous to AquaGO!). Competitive coaches must be minimally 'trained' Competition Introduction.

Go to the Coaching Association of Canada (CAC) and login to your NCCP profile at The Locker

- I do not have an NCCP profile and number: this means you have not yet taken any NCCP courses. You may create a new login using the same link.
- I have an NCCP number but have forgotten it: you can look it up (see below) OR contact the CAC at coach@coach.ca and ask for help to login. Provide your full name and birthdate.
- I am a Club administrator: You can view a coach's NCCP transcript through the <u>CAC's website</u> by obtaining the coach's permission and their NCCP number. AAS will not look them up on your behalf.

DO NOT create a new login if you can't remember your number. Doing this will create an additional profile and you will then have two incomplete profiles. AAS/CAS will only review one profile; therefore it will appear that you do not meet the registration requirements.




AQUAGO! AND RECREATIONAL PROGRAMS:

- AquaGO! Programs: Coaches must be minimally trained as AquaGO! coaches to coach this type of program.
- **Recreational Programs**: Coaches must be minimally trained as AquaGO! or Synchro Instructor (previous to AquaGO!) to coach this type of program.

NOTE: Coaches who are minimally trained in Competition Introduction may also coach recreational programs. They may NOT coach the AquaGO! program



AquaGO! NCCP status: (The terminology in the CAC database is not reflective of the AquaGO! terminology)





Competitive Programs:

Coaches must be minimally trained as Competition Introduction coaches


COMPETITION INTRODUCTION NCCP status:



- This coach is **NOT** eligible to coach competitive programs as they have not completed the NCCP requirements
- The missing requirements are the multi-sport modules and/or the Make Ethical Decision online course and online evauation.
- A coach can review what is missing by clicking on the small 'i'




- When you click on the 'I' this pop-up window will open
- Click on 'Trained Artistic Swimming
 Competition Introduction' to get a list of requirements.



- Select option 2
- In this example, the NCCP requirements that have not been met do not have a date of completion.
- This coach is not eligible to coach



- This means the coach is a trained Competition Introduction coach and is eligible to coach competitive programs and recreational programs only.
- This coach will be eligible to be on deck at competitions for the first two years of having completed modules 1-8 of Competition Introduction. They must be certified in this context to be on deck at a competition by their third year after the course.



- This means the coach is a certified Competition Introduction Coach and is eligible to coach competitive programs and recreational programs. NOT AquaGO!
- This coach is eligible to be on deck at competitions within the province



General Information:

Coaches who intend to coach at National events must be Competition Development trained. By the second time attending a National event the coach must be Competition Development Certified.

A list of the required multi-sport modules can be found through a coaches NCCP profile, by clicking on the small 'I'.

Most courses are completed through The Locker on the Coaching Association of Canada (CAC) website. Coaches can find courses through their NCCP profile, using the E-Learning drop down link.

The Make Ethical Decisions Course is completed through the Alberta Government website.

Club registrars are strongly encouraged to ask a coach for a copy of their NCCP transcript upon hiring or view it as outlined above.
